5. Parish Council meets today after Divine Liturgy.

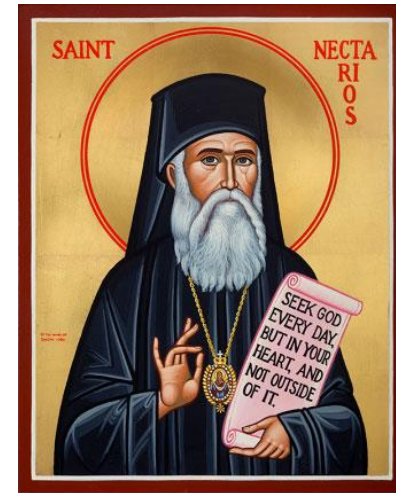
